

Pattern I
مَهْمُوز

Mahmooz verbs are verbs that have a hamza (ء) as one of the root letters.
Some mahmooz verbs are:

أَخَذَ	To take		بَدَأَ	To begin
سَأَلَ	To ask		قَرَأَ	To recite

Example: أَكَلَ¹

(please note-with the exception أَكَلَ, all the other words have a hamza أ with sukoon °.
It is not an alif (ا) with sukoon as it may look)

نَأْكُلُ	We are eating		أَكُلُ	I am eating
تَأْكُلُونَ	You (m.pl) are eating		تَأْكُلُ	You (m.sg) are eating
تَأْكُلْنَ	You (f.pl) are eating		تَأْكُلِينَ	You (f.sg) are eating
يَأْكُلُونَ	They (m) are eating		يَأْكُلُ	He is eating
يَأْكُلْنَ	They (f) are eating		تَأْكُلُ	She is eating

Amr (command) form

كُلِي	Eat!		كُلْ	Eat! (m.sg)
كُلْنَ	Eat! (f.pl)		كُلُوا	Eat! (m.pl)

1 أَكَلَ is conjugated the same way as أَخَذَ and the amr is formed the same way as well
