

Pattern I
مُعْتَلُّ الْعَيْنِ
(أَجُوف)

Weak of 'Ayn (mu'tallul-ayn) verbs have a weak letter as the second root letter. There are three different conjugation patterns for mu'tallul-'ayn verbs. In this chart, we have those verbs conjugated on the pattern of **جَاءَ، يَجِيءُ**. Some mu'tallul-'ayn verbs¹ conjugated on this pattern are:

جاء	To come		عَاشَ	To live
باعَ	To sell		سَارَ	To go/travel
خابَ	To fail		غَابَ	To be absent
زانَ	To decorate		قَاسَ	To measure

Example: **جَاءَ، يَجِيءُ**

نَجِيءُ	We are coming		أَجِيءُ	I am coming
تَحِيُّوُنَ	You (m.pl) are coming		تَجِيءُ	You (m.sg) are coming
تَحِيْنَ	You (f.pl) are coming		تَحِيِيْنِ	You (f.sg) are coming
يَحِيُّوُنَ	They (m) are coming		يَجِيءُ	He is coming
يَحِيْنَ	They (f) are coming		تَجِيءُ	She is coming

Amr² (command) form

جِيئِيْ	Come! (f.sg)		جِيئِ	Come! (m.sg)

2 **The Amr for **جاء** is generally not used. When we want to tell someone to come, we would say: **تَعَالِ** (m.sg), **تَعَالِيْ** (f.sg), **تَعَالُوا** (m.pl) or **تَعَالَيْنَ** (f.pl)**

جِيئُواْ

Come! (m.pl)
