(مِثَال)

Weak of Faa (mu'tallul-faa) verbs have a weak letter² as the first root letter.
Some mu'tallul-faa verbs are:

وَعَدَ	To promise		وَصَلَ	To arrive/connect
وَجَبَ	To be obligatory (used with على)		وَزَنَ	To weigh
وَجَدَ	To find	يَضَعُ ³	وَضَعَ	To put/place
وَقَفَ	To stand/stop	يَقَعُ	وَقَعَ	To fall

Example: وجد

نَجِدُ	We find		أَجِدُ	I find
تَجِدُونَ	You (m.pl) find		تَجِدُ	You (m.sg) find
تَجِدْنَ	You (f.pl) find		تَجِدِينَ	You (f.sg) find
يَجِدُونَ	They (m) find		يَجِدُ	He finds
يَجِدْنَ	They (f) find		تَجِدُ	She finds

Amr (command) form

جِدِي	Find! (f.sg)		جِدْ	Find! (m.sg)
جِدْنَ	Find! (f.pl)		جِدُوا	Find! (m.pl)

3 The conjugation pattern for وضع and وقع is slightly different, with a fat-hah over the middle letter and not a kasrah, as the other six are conjugated (in the present tense)
